- Air travel will be on American Airlines in and out of Memphis through Miami.

 - 2/25/25 Guatemala City > Miami, #1006, 2:17pm - 5:55pm

- Valid passports are required with an expiration date after 8/26/2025

FEE & PAYMENT SCHEDULE

- For FBCOB members the total cost is \$1,525 per person.
- The total cost of the trip for people outside FBCOB is \$2,400 per person.
- This cost includes:
 - BMDMI fee
 - Airline tickets with one checked bag each way
 - Lodging and meals while in Guatemala.
 - Cost of the construction material for the houses we will be building
 - Any other ministry-related expenses.
- Payment schedule:
 - All payments should be made through FBCOB or Borderless Brigade.
Do not pay online through the Managed Mission site.
 - A payment of \$650 is due on or before 11/21/24 (this is the date we must put names on airline ticket)
 - Remaining balance due before 2/15/2025

HEALTH AND SAFETY:

- You should have an up-to-date Tetanus vaccination.
- It is strongly recommended that you consult your health care provider for advice on and prescriptions of pre-trip Prophylactic antibiotics. We will also need to know of any known allergies to Cipro, Levaquin and Zithromax.
- The climate will be hot in February and all team activities will be outdoors.
- The terrain is mountainous and rough.
- Be sure to pack insect repellent (*wipes are easiest to carry*) and sunscreen.

ACCOMMODATIONS:

- Hotel lodging will be arranged by BMDMI Missionaries. This will be double occupancy per room.
- There is a laundry service offered at the hotel for a fee.

DRESS CODE:

- Dress code is much more relaxed in Guatemala than for our Honduras trips, however modesty is always required.
- Knee length shorts are allowed for both men and ladies.
- Comfortable shoes well suited for rough terrain are recommended.
